Patterns in Nature: The Art of Hybycozo
The first exhibition of its kind in Missouri, Patterns in Nature: The Art of HYBYCOZO explores the wondrous connection between art, science and nature through 21 intricately designed and interactive installations located throughout the Missouri Botanical Garden. Created by artists Serge Beaulieu and Yelena Filipchuk, HYBYCOZO's large-scale geometric sculptures reveal the hidden systems that shape the natural world – expressed through light, shadow and monumental form. As sunlight and illumination filter through elaborate designs, shifting patterns bloom across the landscape, inviting guests to reflect on the world around them. Daytime viewing is included in Garden admission, while nighttime viewing is available April 11 to Aug. 29.

Beetlejuice
He earned his stripes on Broadway. Now, the ghost-with-the-most is coming to St. Louis. Based on Tim Burton's dearly beloved film, this hilarious musical tells the story of Lydia Deetz, an unusual teenager whose whole life changes when she meets a recently deceased couple and a demon with a thing for stripes. With an astonishing set, an irreverent book and a score that's out of this netherworld, *Beetlejuice* is "screamingly good fun," according to Variety. Under its uproarious surface (six feet under, to be exact), it's also a remarkably touching show about family, love and making the most of every Day-O!

St. Louis Earth Day Festival
